



# Young Adult Retreat 2019 Camp Report Eric Olsen - Director

After having been through this year's retreat, I am encouraged as to the state of our young adult ministry on this district. Mark Cooper led us through Ezekiel 37, speaking on how God is calling the young adults of his church to own their faith. I felt that the topic resounded with those who attended, and Mark's delivery and insight were authentic and well-received. Additionally, Cameron Smith did an excellent job of leading worship, which created an atmosphere conducive to the receiving of God's wisdom throughout each of our sessions.

I'm pleased to note as well that the retreat maintained the heightened attendance numbers from last year. Given that we saw a doubling in attendance last year over the year prior, one of my primary concerns going into this retreat was to continue this forward momentum and hopefully move the year over year attendance average from 20-25 closer to 40-45. Initial signup numbers seemed to predict that attendance would sit at around 25 young adults, but last minute signups and attendees showing up midway through the retreat brought our total attendance to 41 for the weekend. I believe this underscores a couple points that we should take note of going forward.

Firstly, it demonstrates the efficacy of our current price point. In the two years that we have dropped the retreat price from \$75 to \$35 we have seen a doubling in average attendance. This suggests that the higher price is a markedly limiting factor on retreat attendance, which makes sense given its target audience. Given that we are able to offer the reduced price due to a donation, it may be wise to consider ways to preserve this price indefinitely through some sort of fundraising.

A second takeaway of note comes from that fact that a large percentage of attendees this year either registered less than 10 days prior, or did not register at all and simply showed up. This presented less of an issue this year, as we had prepared enough food/housing to support the final number, but had we experienced this with the number of pre-registered attendees we had last year there may have been a serious logistical problem. I feel that the number of last minute attendees stems from a mixture of shortcomings in advertisement and lack of incentive to register early. It may be of benefit to have a brainstorming session on ways to better advertise via social media, as this is the primary path through which young people will hear about all of our camps, not just Young Adult Retreat. In regards to an early signup incentive, I hesitate to disallow day-of attendees, as I don't want to turn anyone away, but perhaps an incrementally increasing price would drive earlier signups while also offsetting some of our cost.

Overall, I'm happy with how the retreat went, and am excited to see what God has in store for next year!

#### 2018 Senior High Camp Report

We serve an awesome God. It never ceases to amaze me how He brings everything together each year. We see how He has been working in people's lives from the beginning of the week to the end. It is not just the youth that is impacted but counselors and staff as well.

We had sixty-four youth at Senior High Camp this year. There were thirteen tenth graders, nineteen eleventh graders, nineteen twelfth graders, nine that had graduated and four that didn't list their grade. The numbers for female and males were split at thirty-two each. Twenty-five churches were represented plus a missionary teen from Guatemala.

This year we had two teams from Eastern Nazarene College, a worship team, "MOSAIC" and a games team, "CREW". There were seven people on the MOSAIC team and six on the CREW team. Both teams did a great job with our teens.

Bob Keuther, a familiar face on the Brooktondale Campground, was our speaker this year. He always does a great job connecting with the youth and giving direct, relevant messages to them. He also shows that he genuinely cares for each one.

God again placed wonderful counselors and medical staff to be with our teens. Bert Wilmot was our camp nurse this year. But she has always been more than just "the camp nurse". She has been the "mom" away from home. She has spent a large part of her time listening to and praying with the teens. She always seems to know just what to say.

We had eight counselors. I can't thank Leland Buerman, Caleb Lynch, Aubrey Lyon, Leigh Ann Martin, Kailey McGrath, Jack Schmitt, Aaron Stiles and Bekah Zolkosky enough for their willingness to minister to the teens during this week. They each definitely have been given special gifts and God's love was seen through them.

It is always a pleasure to watch God work in the lives of our youth during the week of camp and to see how it shapes them for their journey for after camp. Thank you for the opportunity to come along side others on the district to work with our youth. It is a pleasure, and strengthening for me, to see the work God is doing in their lives.

As we look ahead to the 2019 Fall Retreat, we will be returning to Camp Lamoka! **Save the date: October 11-14, 2019.** The price will remain the same as last year. I am excited to try something a little different involving some of our student leaders. Stay tuned!

It has been an honor to serve our district for the last year as your NYI President. As I write this, our convention is still a few weeks away and I am in awe of the movement I have seen among our teens and young adults in the last year. God is so faithful. Always.

On the district level, it feels like we are finally tying up some loose ends from some of the changes that have occurred in the last few years. As a counsel, we have put together an important safety policy for adult leaders and youth pastors. This policy is meant to not only protect our students and adult volunteers, but also to model accountability as Christ-followers and allow for consistency in expectations at all district level events.

Another change comes from the counsel's recent creation of a young adult sub-committee, made up of representatives who currently serve on the counsel.
